- (e) State Zeroth law of thermodynamics. What is its significance?
- (f) Differentiate CI and Sf engines.
- (a) Two large parallel steel plates of emissivities 0.8 and 0.5 held at temperatures of 1000K and 500 K respectively. A thin copper plate of emissivity 0.1 is introduced as a radiation shield between these two plates. Determine the radiant heat exchanger in W/m² between the plates. Take σ = 5.67 x 10⁻⁸ W/m² K⁴.
 - (b) In a straight tube of 60 mm diameter, water is flowing at a velocity of 12 m/s. The tube surface temperature is maintained at 70°C and the flowing water is heated from the inlet temperature 15°C to an outlet temperature of 45°C. Calculate the following:
 - (i) The heat transfer coefficient from the tube surface to the water,
 - (ii) The heat transferred, and
 - (iii) The length of the tube.

Take the physical properties of water at its mean bulk temperature of 30° C, $\rho = 995.7 \text{ kg/m}^3$, Cp = 4.174 kJ/kg K, $k = 61.718 \text{ X } 10^{-2} \text{ W/m K}$, $v = 0.805 \text{ X } 10^{-6} \text{ m}^2/\text{s}$, Pr = 5.42, Use $Nu = 023 \text{ (Re)}^{0.8} \text{ (Pr)}^{0.4}$

The velocity of steam leaving the nozzle is 660 m/s. Find (i) Blade speed and diagram efficiency assuming no friction along the turbine blades, (ii) If the relative velocity of steam to blade is reduced by 15 % due to friction, find blade efficiency and end thrust.
